OUR QUESTS

1. Compass Creation

- Gather all the contents for your future wrist compasses-2 buckles, paracord, and the compass piece. Tape and scissors may be helpful
- Follow the instructions printed out and the step by step pictures to create your compass bracelet!
- Measuring out the size of the wrist needed may help to know how much to weave, or you can measure as you go

2. Camp Navigation

- Grab your new compass bracelet, camp map, directions key, and find a flat surface to spread your map out on
- Locate the starting location where we last saw Patrick and circle the spot on the map!
- Identify from the directions key which way you need to go, then follow your compass to see which location it leads to next
- After you've marked the landing spot on your map, find the next location from the key and repeat the same steps for each location listed
- Once each location is marked on the map, use the codebreaker at the end of the directions key to figure out the secret message!
- Use the name of each stop marked on the map (i.e. Dining hall, Hangar) and corresponding letters from the key (2nd letter of 3rd stop-like "O" in "Moose") to see what the message is!

HOW TO MAKE A PARACORD BRACELET

ATTACHING THE BUCKLE

- Fold cord in half
- Insert the folded end of cord through one end of the buckle.
- Pull the folded end of the cord out and thread the ends of the cord through the loop. Pull the ends through the loop and tighten into a larks' head knot.
- Take the other ends of the folded cord and hold them evenly together.
- Thread the ends of the cord through the other side of the buckle.
- Pull the ends of the cord through the buckle and form a loop. Unclip/open the buckle.
- Pull the buckles apart until there is approximately seven (7") inches of cord between the buckles.
- Fold the cord and lay the bracelet flat onto a table or flat surface. Make sure that the side where the cords are over the end of the buckle are facing you. The two parallel cords in the center are the base cords. The cords that are on each side are the working cords.

THE MAIN WEAVE

- Lay the right-hand working cord over the base cords.
- Move and lay the left-hand working cord over the right-hand working cord, from right to left.
- Move and place the left-hand working cord under the base cords.
- Pull the left-hand working cord up and through the loop made by the right-hand working cord.
- Tighten the knot.
- Lay the left-hand working cord over the base cords, from left to right.
- Move and lay the right-hand working cord over the left-hand working cord.

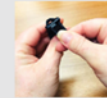
How to Make: **PARACORD BRACELETS**

NEED: MIL-SPEC Paracord in black, olive green, tan, or camo. 5/8" Black Plastic Side Release Buckle. Scissor. Lighter. Ruler or tape measure.



1 FOLD CORD IN HALF

Note: Two colors of the cords are being used in these instructions to show how the cords cross over each other, but one color can be used.



2 INSERT THE FOLDED END of cord through one end of the buckle.



3 PULL THE FOLDED END OF THE CORD OUT then thread the ends of the cord through the loop and tighten into a larks' head knot.



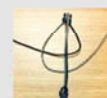
4 TAKE THE OTHER ENDS OF THE FOLDED CORD and hold them evenly together then thread the ends of the cord through the other side of the buckle.



5 PULL THE ENDS OF THE CORD THROUGH the buckle and form a loop. Open the buckle. Pull the buckles apart until you have seven inches of cord between the buckles.



6 FOLD THE CORD AND LAY IT FLAT ON A TABLE. Make sure that the side where the cords are over the end of the buckle are facing you. The two parallel cords in the center are the base cords. The cords that are on each side are the working cords.



7 LAY RIGHT HAND working cord over base cords. Then move and place the left hand working cord under the base cords.



8 PULL THE LEFT HAND WORKING CORD up and through the loop made by the right hand working cord. Tighten the knot.



9 TIGHTEN THE KNOT.



10 LAY THE LEFT HAND WORKING CORD OVER the base cords from left to right. Move and lay the right working cord over the left hand working cord. Move and place the right hand working cord under the base cords.



11 PULL THE RIGHT HAND WORKING CORD UNDER the left hand working cord. Pull the knot snug against the first knot previously made.



12 REPEAT STEPS 7-11 alternating between starting with the left hand working cord and right hand working cord.



13 WHEN YOU'RE FINISHED KNOTTING THE CORDS, cut the cords approximately 1/4" from the bracelet. Use a lighter to fuse/melt the cut ends of the cord.

FINISHED PARACORD BRACELET!



MAIL FINISHED BRACELETS TO SOLDIERS' ANGELS
to be included in care packages to deployed and veterans. A great way to let our service members and veterans know we are thinking about them and we appreciate their services and sacrifices.

- Move and place the right-hand working cord under the base cords.
- Pull the right-hand working cord under and through the loop made by the left-hand working cord.
- Pull the knot snug against the first knot previously made.
- Repeat steps 10-19, alternating between starting with the left-hand working cord and right-hand working cord. If you lose track of which cord to start with, look for the vertical bar on the last knot made. The side that the vertical bar is on will determine which cord you start with. Every so often, gently push the knots towards the top of your bracelet to tighten the bracelet.
- HALFWAY through, slide the compass part onto the strings and then keep weaving after it to lock it into place.
- Cut the working cords approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bracelet.
- Fuse/melt the cut ends of the cord.

Stop 4: Journey 300 degrees over hill and dale, you're doing great!

Stop 5: Venture 330 degrees to our next clue all the way to where camp's trees are housed

Stop 6: LAST STOP! Go 95 degrees to the last spot on the trip

WORD KEY

Stop 1- The 2nd and 3rd letters are the 3rd and 4th letters of the answer

Stop 2- The 2nd letter is the 11th letter of the answer, and the 4th letter is the 5th letter of the answer

Stop 3- The 2nd letter is the answer's 2nd letter, and the 4th letter is the 8th letter of the answer

Stop 4- The 3rd letter is the very 1st of the answer

Stop 5- The 6th and 7th letters of this stop are the 6th and 12th letters of the answer, respectively

Stop 6- The 3rd and 6th letters here are the 7th and 9th letters of the answer
